# **MODERN DRAMA:**

# A Selected Bibliography of Bibliographies

The great increase in bibliographic study in recent years has given researchers the benefit of a ever greater number of bibliographies in the difficult but vital area of contemporary and near-contemporary studies. This proliferation has had its drawbacks, however, and not the least of them is the problem of locating, amid the flood of available material, the most helpful bibliographic tool. This article attempts to alleviate the difficulty by drawing together in a single place a number of complete and serial bibliographies which should be of particular interest to the student of modern drama.

Bibliography is a broad field, and I have narrowed it to include only such material as would seem to be of most immediate use to a hypothetical researcher in the area. First, I have included only bibliographies devoted in whole or part to secondary, or critical works, omitting those concerned solely with various editions, translations, and the like. Second, although I recognize that many valuable bibliographies are found appended to critical studies, I have included only books and articles *primarily* bibliographic in aim. Third, I have restricted my list, as the title suggests, to modern drama, and therefore have included no bibliographies concerned with technical aspects of production or with theater history. Last, I have included no wholly foreign bibliographies—each of the following has at least some entries in English. The entries are annotated unless the title is sufficiently self-explanatory.

#### B. SERIAL BIBLIOGRAPHIES

Bibliographic Index, New York, 1938-date. Published quarterly, cumulated annually. The standard serial bibliography of bibliographies.

Bulletin of Bibliography, Boston, 1897-date. Published quarterly. Primary source of current bibliographical information, including occasional bibliographies of its own. A separate section, the Dramatic Index (q.v.) appeared with it until

Dramatic Index, Boston, 1909-1949. Index to a wide range of periodical material on the drama. Although not as comprehensive as it would at first appear, it is the most complete listing of its type, with articles, reviews, and pictures

from 40 to 50 magazines indexed.

Index to American Doctoral Dissertations, Ann Arbor, 1938-date. Published annually. Cumulative index by general subject matter and author based on

the monthly publication, Dissertation Abstracts.

International Index to Periodicals, New York, 1913-date. Published quarterly, cumulated annually. Author and subject index to a selected group of world periodicals, designed to supplement the Reader's Guide, it is somewhat more scholarly in the material selected.

Modern Drama, "A Selective Bibliography of Works Published in English." Com-

piled by Elizabeth Towne Norton and Robert G. Shedd. 1960-date. Comprehensive guide, planned to appear annually, to books and articles on drama and dramatic theory. Indexed by subject matter, country, and author.

PMLA, "Annual Bibliography," 1929-date. Basic reference list of scholarly material, new books, and important contributions in periodicals and journals to

the study of all modern literatures.

Reader's Guide to Periodical Literature, 1901-date. Published monthly and cumulated frequently. The standard index for the more popular periodicals. Relatively few scholarly articles are listed.

Revue d'Histoire du Thédtre, "Bibliographie," 1948-date. Published quarterly.

Broad, if not always intensive bibliography of theater, and theater-related

material, indexed by subject matter.

Tulane Drama Review, "Books and Theatre," 1958-date. Compiled annually. Selected list of books on drama and the theater, listed by general subject matter. No articles.

of all produced plays.

Lowe, John Adams, William Clyde Fitch," Bulletin of Bibliography, VII (1912), 30-31. Annotated reading list of criticism.

# MILLER, ARTHUR

Eissenstat, Martha Turnquist, "Arthur Miller: A Bibliography," Modern Drama, V, 1 (May, 1962), 93-106. A comprehensive listing of works, including unpublished plays, and of periodical articles and reviews.

## O'NEILL, EUGENE

Bryer, Jackson R., "Forty Years of O'Neill Criticism: A Selected Bibliography,"

Modern Drama, IV, 2 (September, 1961), 196-216. Includes books, parts of
books, articles, and a few outstanding reviews. The aim throughout is to
list the most significant work only.

Miller, Jordan Y., Eugene O'Neill and the American Critic, London, 1962. 513 pp. An outstanding bibliography, annotated and very comprehensive, including

reviews and theses.

Sanborn, Ralph and Barrett H. Clark, A Bibliography of the Works of Eugene O'Neill. New York, 1931. Far less complete, even for the earlier period, than the Miller bibliography, this lists only critical articles and books. Some British entries.

# WILLIAMS, TENNESSEE

Dony, Nadine, "Tennessee Williams: A Selected Bibliography," Modern Drama, I, 3 (December, 1958), 181-91. "Addenda" by Charles A. Carpenter, Jr. and Elizabeth Cook, Modern Drama, II, 3 (December, 1959), 221-23. An adequate listing of articles, books, and reviews. The Addenda tends to emphasize foreign criticism.

Modern Philology, "Victorian Bibliography," 1932-date. Compiled annually. Moved to Victorian Studies in 1957. Useful guide to scholarly articles on British dramatists of the period.

Cutler, B. W., Sir James M. Barrie: A Bibliography, New York, 1931. 242 pp. Emphasizes Barrie's own works, including prefaces and introductions, but includes a section on books about Barrie.

Marrot, Harold Vincent, A Bibliography of the Works of John Galsworthy, New York, 1928. 252 pp. Part II is composed of books and periodicals with material on Galsworthy (English, American, colonial, and continental) plus an iconography.

# JONES, HENRY ARTHUR

Walter, Frank K., "Reading List on Henry Arthur Jones," Bulletin of Bibliography, VI (1911), 273-75. Lists plays, non-dramatic works, and criticisms of both, annotated.

#### MAUGHAM, WILLIAM SOMERSET

Jonas, Klaus W., A Bibliography of the Writings of W. Somerset Maugham, South Hadley, Mass., 1950. 97 pp. Pp. 67-82 are devoted to criticism—a comprehensive listing of articles, books, and portions of books.

Stott, Raymond Toole, Maughamiana, London, 1950. 73 pp. Less complete than the Jonas bibliography. A revised and greatly enlarged version, entitled The Writings of William Somerset Maugham: A Bibliography, which appeared in 1956, dropped all critical material.

Bailey, Shirley J., "John Osborne: A Bibliography," Twentieth Century Literature, VII (October, 1961), 118-20. Lists critical books, articles, and reviews appearing in Britain and America between 1956 and 1960.

# SHAW, GEORGE BERNARD

Broad, C. Lewis and Violet M., Dictionary to the Plays and Novels of Bernard Shaw. London, 1929. 230 pp. Lists works by Shaw, principal productions, all characters, moderately good list of critical books and articles, no reviews.

# C. FRENCH DRAMA

French VII Bibliography, 1949-date. Published annually by The Modern Language Association of America. An extensive cumulative bibliography, one of the best of its kind. The first volume covers 1940 to 1948.

and American books and articles published since 1940 on the French theater a rather scattered listing, with only sections f and g of division IX (pp. 366-67) devoted to modern drama.

- Messner, Charles, "The French Theatre: A Bibliography," Yale French Studies, III (1950), 113-17. A listing of books (no articles) published in English from 1940 to 1950 dealing with the French theater from the seventeenth century
- Talvart, H., and J. Place, Bibliographie des Auteurs Modernes de la Langue Française 1801-date. Paris, 1930-date. A comprehensive listing of works, critical articles, and books. Each volume is complete up to the date of its publication, so there are many more recent articles listed under "Maeterlinck" (Vol. 13, 1956) than under "Daudet" (Vol. 4, 1933). The bibliography is now complete through "M."

Weingarten, J. A., Modern French Dramatists: A Bibliography, New York, 1941. 26 pp. A privately printed bibliography of material appearing between 1918

and 1940. A 28-page Supplement appeared in 1945.

White, Kenneth S., "Notable Books in English and French on Contemporary French Drama: 1957-1960," Modern Drama, V, 2 (September, 1962), 200-22. 1914 to 1960 is considered contemporary. All books are evaluated and given rather lengthy annotation.

Only a few entries in English. Reichart, Walter A., Fifty Years of Hauptmann Study in America 1894-1944: A Bibliography. Privately printed, 1945, 31 pp. Extensive list, including unpublished dissertations and master's theses.

Requardt, Walter, Gerhart Hauptmann: Werke von ihm und über ihn, Berlin, 1931, 3 vol. Much enlarged version of a 1930 bibliography. English and American books and articles listed together in vol. III, pp. 476-96.

Carpenter, William, "A Bibliography of Ibsen," Bookman, I (1895), 274-77. Bibliographic article, devoted mainly to translations.

Firkins, Ina Ten Eyck, Henrik Ibsen: A Bibliography, New York, 1921, 80 pp.

Reasonably complete up until its date.

Ibsen-Arbok, "Bibliography," 1952-date. Published annually in Skien, Norway. An extensive annual bibliography.

#### STRINDBERG, AUGUST

Bryer, Jackson R., "Strindberg 1951-1962: A Bibliography," Modern Drama, V, 3 (December, 1962), 269-75. Planned as a supplement to the Rapp bibliography (below).

Henderson, Archibald, "Strindberg: A Bibliography," Bulletin of Bibliography, VII (1912) 41-42. Short list of works with some articles of criticism.

Kärnell, Karl Ake, August Strindberg, 1849-1949, Malmö, 1949, 103 pp. Mostly Swedish works, but some English entries appear on pages 64 and 65.
Rapp, Esther H., "Strindberg's Reception in England and America," Scandinavian

Studies, XXIII (1951), 1-22, 49-59, 109-37. An impressively complete chronological listing, including books, articles, reviews, and dates of performances. First part considers English material; second part, American books; third part, American periodicals.
